#### Sermon

Have you ever felt left out? Perhaps you were the kid who didn't get invited to the birthday party! I know I was at times.

You know the message of the nativity is that God doesn't want anyone to be left out. Let me take a brief moment to tell you about a man named Jesus. The most important thing that I can tell you about Jesus is that he is God, come to live amongst us. The nativity was his birthday party and in that story there is room for everyone - there is room for you!

Just think of who was included in the first Christmas - in that nativity...can you pick out the characters? There was room for people who are different...

An invitation was sent to a group of people with different coloured skin to Jesus, who came from a far off land, believed in a different God to the God of the Bible and practiced astrology - something the religion of the time prohibited. The wise men! There was room for them at the party.

There was room for those in **poverty**...

They were low paid workers, left out on a hillside. Low status members of society who were not really included in anything. When things went on they were literally left out in the cold. They were the shepherds. There was room for them at the party.

There was room for all ages and genders...

An invitation was sent to a very old woman and a very young woman at a time when women were wrongly marginalised. The younger was unmarried, a potential outcast, the older was barren - unable to have children, judged. The older woman was Elizabeth who gave birth to John the Baptist having walked the pregnancy journey with the young woman who we know as Mary! There was room for them at the party.

An invitation was sent to a family who had to flee for their lives to a foreign country because of an evil dictator. They travelled a long way to escape oppression, probably leaving everything behind. That was, Joseph, with Mary and the newborn Jesus. There was room for them at the party.

There was room for all of **nature**...

An invitation was sent to sheep, oxen, donkeys, camels, even a star! There is room for all creation at the party.

And there was room for God...

Well actually there wasn't. That's the only character there wasn't room for! (The birthday boy!) The inn was full, they were turned away. Until room was found for the party, in a place as unlikely as the guest list - in a stable. In that unlikely place there was room for that unlikely bunch.

And Jesus' desire to make room for people didn't stop at the nativity. He made room for prostitutes, tax collectors, law breakers, the immoral, the ill, the unclean, the low earners and every other ordinary person. (One time he made room for 5,000 all at once!)

There is room for you and me...have you room for Jesus?

I want you to hear the invitation to you. Whether you are able to be present at church this Christmas or not, there is room for you in God's story and God is calling you to take your place. As Isaiah 7 records, the coming of Christ is the sign that there is room for you. As Mary the mother of Jesus can testify, there is room for you whoever you are, however you are regarded or whatever the difficulties and bruises from your journey.

Folks, there is room for you. Is there room for Jesus? Will you make him welcome?

Amen


