We've been imagining together what we hope church will be like post lockdown and I'm really excited by some of the discussions we've been having.

Most exciting is the prospect of hitting the reset button on church and returning to a kind of church that we read about in the beginning, in Acts, and can also see in the early Methodist Church. Both the church universal and the Methodist Church began in intimate groups sharing fellowship, breaking bread, praying for each other and devoting themselves to teaching. I'm looking forward to opportunities to get back, face to face and do these simple things. That would be my birthday wish - a church that turns its eyes to God and gathers shoulder to shoulder (or perhaps with a 2m+ gap between shoulders initially) to tackle life together. This early church had no hymns to begin with and no formal routines, just folk who had been impacted by the life of Jesus and the gift of the holy spirit and sought to have their lives transformed by this.

We've also been investigating, as a staff team, the new 'God for All' strategy in the Methodist Church which is, in a way, reimagining an inclusive church that has the fundamentals at its heart and reaches out. We've been

looking at the 'Methodist Way of Life' and I've been encouraged by how close to the Acts model of church this is. It's exciting to explore what God might be saying to us and to be part of the church at such a time as this.

Join us, this week - on Monday evening, through Zoom to continue the conversation and hopefully reimagine church...

Let's seek together what God is doing and get on board!

How 'leavened' are you?

Reflections from Matthew 13:33 (NRSV)

Jesus also used this illustration: "The Kingdom of Heaven is like the yeast a woman used in making bread. Even though she put only a little yeast in three measures of flour, it permeated every part of the dough."

The struggled to find bread on the shelves. I fondly remember those early baking sessions alongside my kids! Perhaps the most exiting thing about baking, for the kids at least, was the proving process. Our most successful 'rising' was definitely when we acquired fresh yeast (back when yeast was hard to come by). Seeing Olivia's face when the dough we had made had doubled in size after leaving it in the airing cupboard was worth the process all on its own - but then so was the amazing smell of freshly baked bread wafting through the house!

This parable is the smallest of all - I verse, 39 words - so small that I had space to print it in its entirety on this newsletter! Jesus, and his new testament chroniclers certainly knew how to make a few words count though! What a great analogy. The yeast is so important in the baking process. Without the yeast the bread is heavy, doughy in texture and unappetising in taste. Sure there's a place for unleavened bread but that's not to detract from the amazing effect the leavening process has and the unbelievable transformation it brings. This parable is not about the merits of leavened bread over unleavened, it's about the affect something small can have on its surroundings. In a 500g loaf, it only takes a few grams of the powdered yeast to work through the whole batch and transform the loaf. So too with the Kingdom of Heaven!

What effect does the Kingdom of Heaven have on your life? Has it permeated every part of you?

I find it hard not to liken this to the movement of God's Holy Spirit to the power of God to transform our faith. Many a time my children have brought me a toy that has been neglected for some time - the most recent was Daisy, my 3 year old, bringing me a toy fire engine which was not working. To her it was most disappointing that the siren would not sound and the light would not flash. 'Can you fix it Daddy?' she asked with all hope in her eyes. I tried the on off switch and pummelled the buttons - to no avail. Then, as she watched on with anticipation, I unscrewed the battery cover and changed the power cells. Instantly the sirens sounded, the lights flashed and her eyes also lit up! 'You fixed it, Daddy!' she exclaimed. (If only all the problems we encounter in life could be fixed so easily!)

Yet many of the problems we face in our faith do have an easy remedy. That's not to devalue our struggles which are complex and often 'unfixable'. We are not here to be fixed but if we find our faith to be flat, heavy, doughy and unappetising, then perhaps what we lack is a divine leavening! Perhaps our spiritual batteries are flat and we are in need of a fresh injection of power to bring us back to life!

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We have not long since moved from the pentecost narrative. Much has been made of the disciples in a locked room and parallels drawn with our situation - much has also been made of our God's ability to enter that locked room and reach us where we are but it's what followed that I want to take us back to. When the disciples experienced the Holy Spirit in that upper room, it was as though someone had changed their power cells! It was instantaneous and God's power worked through them like a batch of the most powerful yeast, reaching every fibre of their being and raising them up from a heavy, lifeless bunch into a world changing revolution!

I remember the first time I was filled with the Holy Spirit, 28 years ago. The chap who prayed with me was called Lee - he's been a missionary in Tenerife amongst the clubbers on Veronica's strip since then. He prayed with me because I'd noticed how lifeless my faith was alongside some of my peers. I knew and believed what the Bible said, I was utterly convinced of God's love for me and was undoubtedly 'saved' (if you like that word to describe those who are accepted as followers of Christ) but still my faith was a bit lifeless. That evening I was filled to overflowing with the Holy Spirit and life has never been the same since. When describing me, I think it's fair to say, there are often some common words that people use (alongside those I don't care to repeat!) such as enthusiasm, passion, energy. I know they're sometimes misguided - I'm as human and failing as the next person but what I won't be accused of is being flat! Every time the air is knocked out of me, spiritually, it's as though the yeast knows exactly what to do and before long the leavening process has lifted me up again. Praise God!

I must confess I've had the wind knocked out of me spiritually in the last week or so - who wouldn't when faced with the task of leading a scattered church of confused and hurting people - especially when I'm isolated, confused and hurting myself too. Perhaps you feel like you've had the wind knocked out of you spiritually, during the Covid-19 pandemic - it's understandable. Only trust God and ask God to fill you again with the power of his Holy Spirit.

Take a moment now. It's a really simple prayer that I've invited folk to pray countless times and I've invited you to pray it several times in these letters. It really simple, yet incredibly powerful. It's just three words but whatever the situation and whoever you are it will have an impact. Like a small amount of yeast, the kingdom of heaven will permeate every part of you. Just three words, but you have to mean them with every fibre of your being. The words are 'Come Holy Spirit.' Pray them daily and allow God, the master baker, to kneed that yeast throughout the batch, lovingly caressing your soul until every lump and bump is smoothed out and ready to rise. Don't delay because when the heat is on, the unleavened bread is fixed as unleavened and so much harder to rise - whereas when the heat is on those who have allowed God to transform them into part of his

kingdom, they become the daily bread that this world really

needs: feeding and satisfying all around us. It's time to rise!

FAMILY ACTIVITIES!

This week's Bible passage is an ideal opportunity to bake with your kids (if you have time!) You could show them the yeast which looks small and insignificant and then show them the dough before and after its had chance to rise.

The attached youtube clip (https://www.youtube.com/watch?

<u>v=Lqxwv0mE5jQ</u>) has a great explanation for kids too, so it's well

worth a watch: "How does the Kingdom of Heaven grow? Like yeast! How does yeast grow? Yeast, just like the Kingdom, grows on the INSIDE before it shows on the OUTSIDE!"

You can describe the Kingdom of God as letting God be King in our lives and living his way. It starts inside as we ask God to change into how he wants us to live (by praying) but as it grows in us, it makes a difference to how we live on the outside with the kind of good qualities that we call the fruits of the spirit. (You could read parts of Galatians chapter 5 to help with this!)

If you don't have time to bake bread then you can always slice some bread and talk about the tiny holes that make the bread soft and yummy (or show them the picture above). You could explain that the yeast in bread making is a living ingredient inside the bread that may be small (and each hole is small) but these bubbles, made when the yeast 'breathes' make a massive difference to the bread which would otherwise be heavy, doughy and much less tasty! You could finish by making a yummy sandwich with their favourite fillings! Have fun!

PRAYER: Dear Father God, Thank You for including us in Your Kingdom of Heaven. Help us to grow in Your Love, like the yeast, spreading Your love to others. In Jesus' Name, amen.
